A WALK DOWN THE PATH

On: A History Remembered

Independence Day has arrived once again. Independence Day is celebrated nationwide as a statement of freedom and a uniquely American heritage. We celebrate with family or with friends or with neighbors. We have picnics and parties. We wait till dark and shoot fireworks. We will do all of that this Saturday at Rolling Hills. We've done so for several years, and now our parking lot fills up with folks who join in with us. This celebration is a terrific time to mingle with guests and invite them to worship on Sunday morning.

I thought I'd remind us all of those visionaries who took the risk to lead the colonies with a vision of democracy and independence from the growing monarchical colonial abuses of mother Britannia and King George. Read and listen to the resonance of these remarkable words from *The Declaration of Independence*:

When in the Course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation.

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.

Much more is said in the text of the document, including such things as the intentions of the colonies in forming a new government, some driving principles of the new government, and a list of grievances against the King and Parliament.



The last line of the document has always been moving to me:

And for the support to this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor.

"Fifty-six men signed that document. Nine died of wounds or hardships during the war. Five were captured and imprisoned, in each case with brutal treatment. Several lost wives, sons or entire families. One lost his 13 children. Two wives were brutally treated. All were at one time or another the victims of manhunts and driven from their homes. Twelve signers had their homes completely burned. Seventeen lost everything they owned. Yet not one defected or went back on his pledged word. Their honor, and the nation they sacrifice so much to create, is still intact." (Rush Limbaugh, *The Americans Who risked Everything*)

The foundation of this document, of the devotion of these men to one another and their cause, was not some narcissistic desire to feel good, to get rich, to have some sexual license, or to make some political statement. The foundation was an understood created integrity of the individual after the design of the Creator God.

As we approach this annual celebration of a great and monumental day in our nation's history, remember their sacrifice for honor. History is to be remembered, not forgotten. God has granted our great nation a wonderful heritage, not because He is on our side, but because we were on His side. Reflect upon how you can utilize your faith to enhance your citizenship to return our nation to His side.

May God always bless America. The land that we love.

Ready for some fun in the sun? We are working on an all-church family swim time at the pool, in early August. Watch upcoming bulletins for more information!

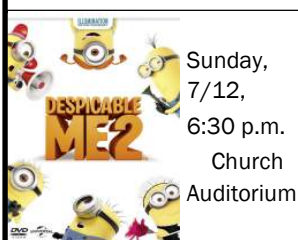


INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION
