A WALK DOWN THE PATH

On: The Super Bowl

Sunday is the Super Bowl. I've heard announcers proclaim that it is the greatest sporting event in America. In fact, the Super Bowl is such a big deal that the commercials and the half-time entertainment are as newsworthy as the game itself. People throw or attend Super Bowl parties just to be part of the celebration even if they don't have any interest in the game itself so that many times the party is the event, not the actual Super Bowl.

This year is Super Bowl 50 which the NFL has promoted since the preseason. The first Super Bowl featured the Green Bay Packers and our local Kansas City Chiefs. The story is told that the owners didn't really know what to call the first one until Lamar Hunt thought of the popular toy, superball, and suggested Super Bowl. It stuck.

Professional football's popularity is phenomenal. I saw a trailer for the movie "Concussion" (about the NFL's diagnosis and treatment of that injury among its players) in which a line goes something like this, "Churches used to own Sundays. Now the NFL does." That may sound surprising, astonishing, or arrogant but it's probably truer than we'd like to believe.

When the Kansas City Chiefs are at home, 78,000 people will give up their entire Sunday to attend the game. Thousands will tailgate for hours before the game. After the game is over a few hours will be spent leaving the stadium and getting home. From a few to several hundred dollars will be spent by every person or family there by the time they've bought their tickets, paid for parking, tailgated, and purchased food and drinks inside the stadium. That doesn't include all the Chiefs gear they buy so that everyone knows what a devoted fan they are.

And the weather. Rain, sleet, snow, cloudy, sunny, hot, sunburn, freezing wind chill, regardless of the elements the stands are full and people are loud. All schedules are arranged around the frenzy of the event's entertainment.

Then there's church. The contrast is almost comical. If it's snowy, cold, or rainy some

Christians stay home in their cozy beds. Or if it's really nice outside, sunny and warm, some Christians will head for the lake, the golf course, a sporting event, or stay home to work in the yard.

You know, I think the NFL may be right. The church, which used to own Sundays, has lost its dominance to a lot of other distractions. Are the distractions better? No, I don't think so. I think the problem is a tendency in our comfortable culture to have a lazy and undisciplined faith. Not all Christians fall into this malaise, of course, but the general atmosphere of Christianity has changed over the decades in our nation.

So what can we do? No need for despair, for many Christians have a healthy and committed faith. Many Christians have a great confidence in their community of believers and have a great enthusiasm to be together in worship.

When Elijah was caught up in self-pity thinking he alone stood for God against evil in Israel in 1 Kings 19, the Lord told him (v. 18), "I will leave 7,000 in Israel - every knee that has not bowed to Baal and every mouth that has not kissed him."

The church can take back Sundays, you know. We take it back one person at a time, one family at a time, one group of friends at a time who determine that being in worship with fellow believers is enjoyable, encouraging, and pleasing to God. After all, a really big Super Bowl is coming someday that will dwarf anything the NFL can think of. That Super Bowl will feature team Jesus arriving with all his players and fans when heaven is opened for all to see the glories of His grandeur. Regardless of who you cheer for this Sunday keep in mind it's just a game. Regardless of which team wins, the events of history will continue. On the other hand, we would be well served to remember the greater perspective of the "Super Bowl" when Jesus returns, for that is more than a game. And when He arrives, history will be over so be certain you're cheering for the right team in that game.



Happy birthday to all! On Sunday, February 28, we will celebrate everyone's birthday with our annual all-church birthday party, starting at 6 p.m.


