A WALK DOWN THE PATH

On: Read, Read, Read

Every year we encourage everyone to read their Bibles through. This year is no exception.

The reading schedule that we made available this year is different from the schedule that we printed and promoted for many years. The One Year Bible Reading Plan that we are using is published by Good News Publishers out of Wheaton, Illinois. I am using this plan this year and am enjoying it very much. If you haven't started using it, you can pick one up and get started.

Several people have told me that they are reading through their Bible using this guide. During a conversation with one person, he said that this was the first time he's ever read the Bible through. He told me he didn't know why he'd never done it before, but he was enjoying finding things in the Bible that he'd didn't know were there. The fun of discovery only happens as we take advantage of our opportunity to look.

I've read the Bible through many times and never tire of the exercise. I'll grant you that some areas of Scripture are more interesting than others, and some areas are more laborious to wade through than others, but all of them are significant. Everything between the covers of that Book is there because God deemed it all to be important.

Perhaps when reading through all the ritual requirements in Leviticus, you get bogged down. Remember that all those rituals were to guide people to holiness and to a respectful response to Jehovah. A failure of keeping all those rituals highlighted the need for a Redeemer, which of course proved to be Jesus. Or perhaps reading all the names in the genealogies in Genesis or 1 Chronicles or other locations seems laborious, but each name represents a person who was important to God, so He included them. Sometimes we know who the person was or what the person did. Sometimes a statement is made about the person that gives that name significance. But our lack of knowledge of that person does not make the person insignificant; it only reminds me that I am also insignificant to God even though history will probably not remember me for anything of significance. Those names

are important to read because God, not history, gives us our significance.

I always encourage people to read their Bibles with a pen in hand. Underline phrases or verses that strike you or stand

out to you for some reason. Circle names or key words that tie ideas together. Make notes in the margins. Jot cross references to other passages that have a similar idea or that you tie to another passage or biblical event so you can refer to it. All of this personalizes your text to you and helps you to digest it and remember it. The more times you read through that Bible, the more notes you will have and the better you will know the Word. Some hesitate to do this because they feel it is defacing the Word. I understand. Personally, I consider it to be sharpening my Sword, so I continue to do this year after year.

Linda & I aren't wealthy, and we don't really have much in the way of family heirlooms, but I do have something that I hope my kids and grandkids will find enjoyable. My Bibles.

I have 25 to 30 Bibles or more, including a Hebrew Old Testament and a Greek New Testament. Among my English Bibles are 10 or 11 that I have used from high school into college and throughout my 38 years of ministry. They are various translations and versions and are in various conditions. Some are in serious disrepair. For example, the Bible I started using in my high school years has been taped together since the early 1970's. All of those Bibles have notations, asterisks, underlining, cross references, circles, different colors of ink and so on. I started all over again last year with a new Bible. It will take me years for it to become an old friend like the others, but it'll get there. But someday, those who come after me will open those Bibles and hopefully see the character of the owner and know how much he loved the Writer.

The legacy of faith is something I inherited and plan to pass on. You can too. So start today. Use your Sword. Keep it sharp. Make it something that others will see as having great value.
