A WALK DOWN THE PATH

On: How'd we get to where we are today?

A little over a year ago, the leader of the women's Thursday morning Bible study asked me if I would teach a course for them for about six weeks about how the Christian Church movement came about. I said I would, thinking I could get it all done in about four weeks. The plan was to begin the study in mid-September and continue through October.

During the summer I began thinking about how I wanted to approach the study. I told myself, "Self, to understand the Christian Church today (the Restoration Movement), you need to teach about how it got started. Then you can talk about where we are today." Good plan.

Then I said to myself, "Self, to understand how the Restoration Movement got started, you need to explain why the early preachers of the movement felt a need for something different from their denominations of origin." Good plan.

Then I said to myself, "Self, to understand why the Restoration Movement's originating preachers thought something ought to change, you need to explain what they were changing from. That means you have to do some teaching about the Reformation Movement in Europe." Good plan.

Then I said to myself, "Self, to appreciate the Reformation Movement in Europe, you need to teach about how the church had progressed to that point from its 1st century origins to the Roman Catholic church from which the Reformation Movement emerged." Good plan.

Then I said to myself, "Self, to truly appreciate the origins of the church itself, you need to refresh everyone's memories about the history of God's redemptive work with Israel in the Old

Testament. That way, the ideas that are presented for the church can be better understood and applied." Good plan.

Then I said to myself, "Self, to really get a good grasp of how and why God worked with and through Israel as He did, you really need to demonstrate through Scripture why He is Sovereign which takes us back to creation." Good plan.

So I began putting together an outline and ideas. We began the "six week course" in mid-September and finished the "six week course" about six MONTHS later. I really enjoyed it and believe the ladies did as well...at least they said they did. Some suggested that it would be good to offer this study for the whole church.

So, that's what I'm going to do. On Wednesday evenings for about an hour, beginning September 18 at 6:30 p.m., I'll be using that material (probably with a few additions) to give an overview of how we got from the beginning of creation to Rolling Hills Christian Church in 2013. We'll call it, "An Overview of Our History of Faith." Everyone is invited. All questions are encouraged and will be answered to best of my memory and or ability. We'll take a break for seasonal events and will conclude when we progress to today.

I hope you find this to be an interesting and helpful opportunity to better understand the development of God's kingdom on earth throughout history, undergird your own faith and give you more confidence in our history as a congregation and as a part of the Kingdom of God.

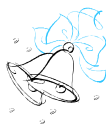

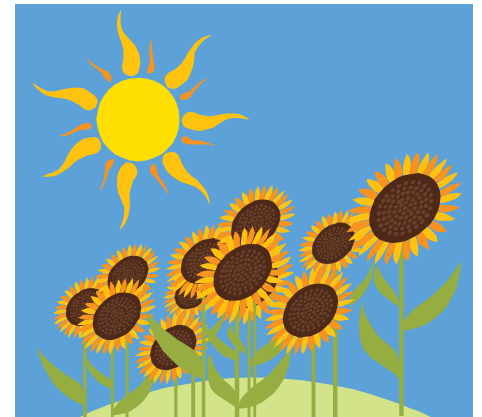
