A WALK DOWN THE PATH

On: A New Year, A New Plan

January 1, 2019, ushers in a fresh look at life plans and life routines. Everyone can put a fresh coat of paint on all those well-worn patterns of every-day living. All of those, "I wish I had done that..." can now become, "Here's what I'm going to do...."

Perhaps that "to do" list will include diet. I have always struggled with diet. And when I say struggle, I mean...vegetables wrestle me to the ground attempting to become my friends, but thus far I have successfully been able to fight them off! On the other hand, it probably wouldn't hurt (and my doctor would encourage) me to expand my culinary tastes to include some edible vegetables (this does not include broccoli, cauliflower, asparagus, etc.) and salads occasionally.

Perhaps that "to do" list will include exercise. My thumbs have become much stronger since the manufacture and availability of remote-control devices. On the other hand, other parts of my body are not as strong as they should be. In fact, I've noticed a tendency for my muscles to reconfigure themselves in the middle area of my physique. I believe my body's strategy is to reduce wind drag when running the bases in softball by becoming more aerodynamically rounded...you know like cars have become. It probably wouldn't hurt to pump some iron and do some cardio regularly. (Actually, it might hurt a little bit, but it would probably be a good hurt.)

Perhaps that "to do" list will include spiritual sensitivity enhancement. I've been pretty good at reading and studying my Bible on an annual reading plan most years. But a person never becomes completely proficient unless he or she continues to sharpen the blade of their Word by continually learning more, reading more, and self-evaluating more. That self-evaluating by the Word's influence affects our moral and ethical conscience awareness, our discipline of meeting with fellow believers, our trusting in God and limiting of our greed by giving regularly and generously, our engagement in volunteering to make the Kingdom more productive and effective,

and generally improving our character. Sounds like a lot, and it sounds difficult or complex, but like any worthwhile journey, it all begins by taking one step and following that with another, and so on. Progress, whether methodical or frantic, is always better than standing still.

Perhaps that "to do" list will include some comfort flexibility. No doubt, this will be a big issue in my coming year, as well as for our congregation. I'm going to be retiring come May. While I don't really want that to be a big deal, it probably will be a big deal. I expect it to be challenging for me to emotionally alter what I've been doing for the past 44 years. I'll be developing new routines, new daily plans. I have some things I enjoy that I look to enjoy even more and will have some new and different opportunities that I'll be able to try.

This flexibility will not only affect me. It will also affect our congregation. I will see if my teaching and preaching has been effective all these years through the acceptance of our church leadership in performing new roles in guiding the congregation in the search of a new preaching pastor. I will see how church members rally in support of the efforts of the church leadership and in support of the visionary and expansive ideas of the new pastor candidate, whoever that may turn out to be.

The new year brings with it many new hopes, plans, experiences, emotions, and adjustments. We will all have some surprises sprung on us, but our intention to be flexible will permit us to adjust, adapt, and grow as individuals in our faith, and as a congregation in our faith. The old is comfortable and familiar. The new is exciting and challenging. Jesus used the picture of pouring new wine into old wineskins as a reminder that new perspectives can disrupt our old practices. I think I could use some uncomfortable stretching. It will be good to pour some new wine into these old wineskins with the dawning of a new year.
