### A NOTE FROM THE ELDERS


This month's Elder Note comes from Bill Hollingshead and his daughter, Jennifer Lotspeich. Bill writes, "I was told to write about anything I wanted to. This article was written by my daughter, Jennifer, who most of you know:"

Over the years our family vacations have revolved around the ocean and beach. This year we went to San Diego and stayed at Imperial Beach. One night, my husband David and I sat out on our balcony looking out at the ocean listening to the waves and talking. As we sat there. I thought, in a world so altered by the hands of man the ocean is never changing. Since God spoke the world into existence it has remained the same. The ocean doesn't consider the events of man and change course. I thought of WWII and how battles turned the water red with the blood of soldiers, or the many horrific things that washed up on shore. But the ocean remains unchanging. From this idea it was an easy segue comparing the ocean to our Lord. Throughout time He has remained constant and never changing. The sins of man do not alter his course or change who He is.

It is easy in our culture today to observe how hard people work to try and disprove the existence and involvement of God. In spite of their efforts, the Bible says in John 1:3-5 "Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." So how is God like the ocean? This story is one of a kind. One Saturday two women showed up at the train to pay for everyone's train admission for one day. Their father had recently died and he stipulated that a portion of his estate be used to purchase everyone's train admission for one day. I didn't remem-

ber the gentleman but one of his daughters showed me a picture taken the day he rode the train with them. To my surprise there I was in the middle.

Finally, three siblings who looked to be in their forties wanted me to take their picture on a specific car of the train. When they were children their mother brought them to the park and took their picture on that exact car. They wanted to duplicate the picture as best as they could. Later they told me that they had been doing this for a number of years.

Over my five years working the train I have heard many times from many different people, "I rode this train when I

was a child and now I am bringing my grandchildren to ride." Every time I hear that it always fills me with joy thinking that in some small way I am playing a part of their memories.
