Have you ever been nervously excited?

There is an official term for this called "anxiety reappraisal", which refers to when you convince yourself (consciously or subconsciously) that you are excited when you feel nervous. Individually speaking, both emotions cause your heart to beat a little faster and your mind and body begin to prepare for some form of action. We tell our minds that when we are nervous, we are also excited. Or when we are excited, we might be a little nervous. Both scenarios can cause positive or negative anxiety.

Let me put it this way. Think of your first time going on a roller coaster or maybe racing down the highway with your friends. Ok, so you don't like roller coasters or fast cars. Think about your first day on the job, the day you got married or the birth of your first born. All these events give us the opportunity to experience the tension between both excitement and nervousness.

Recently, we changed our mission statement to say, "At Rolling Hills we exist to lead others to become fully devoted followers of Jesus." Rooted in the Great Commission from Jesus, found in Matthew 28:18-20, is a mission given to every follower of Jesus. A mission that instructs us to "go" and to "make" disciples. This makes me *nervously* excited.

Over the span of my short life, I have seen numerous people come to faith in Jesus. Watching someone become a follower of Jesus and trust their entire life to him is an amazing spectacle that God does in one's life. I get so excited when someone makes a decision to follow Jesus and then is baptized.

But to get involved in someone's life and share your story of faith with them is nerve-racking or at least to me it is! The thoughts of doubt quickly come: "What will they think of me?", "What if they hate me afterwards?" or, "What if I screw this up and they hate me and God?". The unknown is scary and can make anyone nervous.

So what do we do with this tension of excitement and nervousness? How do we overcome our fears yet long for adventure?

Recently in our current message series, Difference Maker, I said, "faith is not the absence of fear, it is

the willingness to surrender despite your fear." You and I will always battle against our worries and fears, whether in the midst of change, tragedy or opposition, we will experience emotions that will lead us to be nervous, but it is our faith in Jesus Christ that will help us through those fears.

At Rolling Hills, we are not just experiencing mission statement changes, but also physical and spiritual change. Physical walls are being torn down to meet our mission. Spiritual walls are being torn down and we are seeing marriages being reunited because of Jesus.

As I have conveyed to you before, I seek to be a honest leader. An individual who is transparent and vulnerable and willing to go against the grain of traditional styles of leadership and share what is on my heart. Coming to Topeka had me *nervously* excited. Some of the changes we have implemented here have had me *nervously* excited. Yes, even the tearing down walls to make more room has had me *nervously* excited.

Scripture challenges us to, "Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight." (Proverbs 3:4-5).

The conclusion that I come to is this: Surrendering our preferences, comforts, ideas, opinions.... our lives to Jesus, is extremely difficult to do. Yet, following Jesus is always exciting; the question is will we let our nervous fears take over or will we live in the tension of constantly surrendering our lives to lesus?

We came to Rolling Hills because of what we saw as an opportunity to reach North Topeka with the Gospel of Christ! Even though our methods and objectives might be slightly different, would you consider coming "All-In" with us on this journey? It's all right if you are nervously excited. We are too, but we have the Kingdom of God in our favor!


#### Chair-raiser
